Please read the following overview of the Application Process:

1. How to apply for a program:

- a. Complete RSC Program Application[□]. The college recommends reviewing the Admissions Requirements for the program to which you are applying. The requirements are in listed Sections Five and Six of the College Catalogue. The Catalogue is available at www.steinercollege.edu under *Student Services*.
- b. \$70 application fee (early application fee is \$50: paid 30 days or more before program start date).
- c. Have official transcripts mailed to Admissions Office at RSC. MA students will be given separate instructions.

2. Application Process:

- a. Once received, the Program Application is reviewed by Admissions Office and Program Director.
- b. Acceptance status is (e)mailed to student.
- c. RSC Loan and Scholarship Application[□] reviewed (if applicable — see process below).
- d. If accepted, contracts are (e)mailed to student for signature (will include applicable loan and scholarship info).
- e. Signed contracts and payment of tuition and fees are due 10 business days before program start-date. Late fees apply after this time.

3. Application Process for RSC Loans and Scholarships:

- a. Submit completed RSC Loan and Scholarship Application[□] with latest IRS tax forms and pay stub.
- b. Pay \$15 Fee for credit check.
- c. Include letter explaining unusual circumstances or expected changes not obvious on form.
- d. Loan and Scholarship Applications are considered by the RSC Loan and Scholarship Committee.
- e. Student notified via email of scholarship status in an Award Letter.
- f. To accept a scholarship, student needs to sign and return the Award Letter to the college.
- g. For RSC Loans, student will be notified if they do not qualify, otherwise contracts are drawn up.
- h. Contracts are drawn up and (e)mailed to student for signature.
- i. Signed contracts and payment of tuition and fees are due 10 business days before program start-date. Late fees apply after this time.

4. Assessment Process for Foundation Studies Course Exemption:

- a. Indicate on Program Application that an assessment for Foundation Studies is requested.
- b. Turn in Equivalency Assessment Worksheet[◇] with Foundation Studies transcript or letter of completion.
- c. Pay \$50 Assessment Fee.
- d. Assessment request and Fee may be submitted before applying, or with a Program Application.
- e. A Course Equivalency will be completed by the Academic Dean or Program Director. The completed Assessment will be returned to the Admissions Office and emailed to student.
- f. Student must contact Admissions for applicable tuition and fees when additional Foundation Studies courses at RSC are required.

Students attending classes without signing student contracts, loan contracts, or completing tuition payment will be charged **additional** late fees in **\$100.00 increments** every 7 days from the 1st day of class (i.e. 1st - 6th days of class: late fee = \$100. On 8th day: late fee = \$200, etc.).

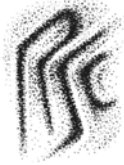
Student Expenses:

- TaskStream Registration** is required for all students enrolled in full-time Foundations Program, and all Teacher Education Programs. Students will access all of their syllabi, and turn in all of their key assignments through this online student/faculty communication system. New students will be given information about paying for their account. Current prices are \$42 for 1 year, 2yrs = \$69, 3yrs = \$91, additional years are \$14 each. Any computer that can access the internet can be used to logon to this program, including the computers in the library. If the college chooses another program at a future date, it will be the student's responsibility to pay for all appropriate fees.
- COMPUTER Requirements:** students need to have regular access to a computer with a fairly recent operating system and user-owned version of Microsoft *Word 2007* or *Microsoft Word 2008 for Mac* (these contain the necessary tools for academic writing). Students must pay for individual IT support for their personal computers.
 - MA students** are required to have a laptop with a minimum wireless capability of *802.11g* for required use in class
- All Teacher Training Students:** Students who are not already teaching may incur additional travel expenses associated with practice teaching and may need to have a one-time TB test (approx. \$15-\$20) and one or two Livescans (electronic fingerprint check) costing up to \$96 ea. Some states may require a physical exam. The student is responsible for contacting the Waldorf School they are assigned to for details. Students who are teaching may incur telephone expenses for mentoring or faculty living and/or meal expenses for required field observation.
 - Summer Part-Time:** Students in the Summer Waldorf Education and Part-Time Programs should expect to spend \$270 for materials each year for books and items such as eurythmy shoes, arts supplies and musical instruments. Living expenses for a single student are approximately \$260/week.
 - San Francisco and CLC Teacher Ed. Programs Students:**
 - Are required to attend summer semesters in Fair Oaks and all living expenses are the responsibility of the student (approximately \$500 per year).
 - SF students may have weekly refreshment expenses (total is approx. \$60 from Sept-May).
 - Fall:** Students in residential programs should expect to spend \$250-\$400 for materials each year (books, eurythmy shoes, arts supplies and musical instruments). Living expenses for a single student are approximately \$1200 per month in Fair Oaks. Students in part-time programs should expect to spend \$200-300 for materials each year (books, eurythmy shoes, musical instruments and arts supplies).

† **NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND DEGREES EARNED AT RUDOLF STEINER COLLEGE:** Credits earned at Rudolf Steiner College in most cases will not be transferable to any other college or university. For example, if you enter Rudolf Steiner College as a freshman, you will still be a freshman if you enter another college or university at some time in the future even though you earned credits at Rudolf Steiner College. The transferability of credits earned at Rudolf Steiner College is entirely up to the transferee institution over which Rudolf Steiner College has no authority. In addition, if you earn a degree, diploma or certificate at Rudolf Steiner College, in most cases it will not serve as a basis for obtaining a higher level degree at another college or university.

Cancellation & Refund Policy for Academic Year 2011-12

BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL: Students may cancel their enrollment agreement in writing at any time and, if cancellation is received prior to or on the first day of instruction, will be eligible for a full refund of all refundable fees. Notice of cancellation must be addressed to:

Cancellation shall be effective upon receipt of **written notice**. Cancellation of enrollment received after the first day of instruction will be refunded according to the refund statement below. Students who wish to cancel enrollment are encouraged to consult with the Admissions Officer.

REFUND POLICY: All refunds will be processed within 30 days of cancellation notice. If cancellation occurs prior to or on the first day of instruction, a full refund will be made of all refundable fees (see fee schedule), minus a \$100 registration fee. If cancellation is made after the first day of instruction and prior to 60% completion of the program, a pro rata refund will be calculated on the basis of clock hours remaining for completion of the program minus a \$100 registration fee. **If cancellation occurs after 60% of program completion, no refund will be made.** *Example:* If a student withdraws after attending 200 clock hours of an 800 clock hour program, the refund will be based on 600 clock hours divided by 800 clock hours (75%) minus \$100 administration fee. If a student withdraws after attending 600 clock hours of an 800-clock hour program, no refund will be made.

Refunds apply to complete withdrawals only: There are no refunds for classes or courses missed within a program. Students have the option of being a part-time or custom student and will be charged at a different rate per unit. Students who do not attend classes for three consecutive weeks, without notifying the Admissions Office, will be automatically withdrawn and no refund will apply.
